1. The arrangement of the exhibits will be directed by the superintendent with the help of his assistants and be classified wherever possible.
2. Exhibitors must not change their exhibit or any part thereof after the hour designated for the same to be in place. A violation of this rule will mean forfeiture of any and all premiums won in this department by exhibitor.
3. All entries must be the product of this year, with the exception of popcorn, and soybeans.
4. All entries must conform to the standard variety type. At the discretion of the judge they may be disqualified.
5. No entries may be exchanged.
6. No water or plastic bags on exhibits. (Except those otherwise specified.)
7. Be sure you have the right name for the entry.
8. All sheaves must have roots removed.
